

## To the MNHPC Community and Our Members,

I am sharing important news that our Executive Director, Jessica Hausauer, has notified the board that she will be departing the organization to assume the same position for the **National Coalition for Hospice and Palliative Care.** Jessica has done an excellent job of leading the organization since 2020 and we will miss her leadership.

## **Updates**

With this news, I want to share a few updates with you. The first is that because of MNHPC's highly capable and committed team, all programming will be held as planned, including the **Regulatory and Legislative Summit** (September 29), the **Palliative Care Summit** (November 17), and the April 2024 Annual Conference. Please note the Annual Conference Call for Proposals will be extended from September 15 to September 22.

## **Transition and Search Process**

Leadership transitions always raise a variety of questions and possible avenues for how to most effectively navigate the immediate future. And, they always bring change. After extensive discussion among MNHPC's Executive Committee, the board considered a proposal and subsequently approved a plan to move forward with an interim Executive Director through the spring of 2024, while concurrently launching a search for a permanent Executive Director.

MNHPC's board is committed to giving time, attention, and intention to selecting the next leader of the organization. A search committee is currently being formed and the process for selecting a permanent Executive Director will be launched in the coming weeks.

## **Interim Executive Director: David Blomquist**

I am excited to share that the MNHPC board unanimously approved a proposal to name **<u>David Blomquist</u>** as interim Executive Director. David is no stranger to MNHPC – he has been involved in board and committee work since 2015, and most recently served almost 4 years on the Executive Committee as the board Secretary.
